About This Report

This annual Management Report of Fund Performance of Lysander-Fulcra Corporate Securities Fund (the “Fund”) contains financial highlights for the year ended December 31, 2021 but does not contain the complete financial statements of the Fund. This report should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Fund for the year ended December 31, 2021. Lysander Funds Limited (the “Manager”) is the manager of the Fund. Investment objective

The Fund’s objective is to provide income and capital growth by investing in fixed income, floating rate, convertible, preferred equity, and common equity securities of corporations anywhere in the world.

Investment Strategies

The Fund’s portfolio manager is Fulcra Asset Management Inc. (“Portfolio Manager” or “Fulcra”). The Fund seeks to provide income and capital growth by primarily investing in fixed income, floating rate, convertible, preferred equity, and common equity securities of corporations primarily

headquartered in North America, with a focus on fixed income securities.

Fulcra is focused on generating absolute returns that do not replicate any particular index or competing funds in the same category.

The Fund may invest (at the time of purchase) up to 15% of its net assets in issuers based outside of North America. More details are contained in the Fund’s simplified prospectus.

Risks

The risks of this Fund remain as discussed in the Fund’s most recent simplified prospectus or its amendments.

Results of Operations

The Fund's Series A units returned 10.5% year-to-date, and the Series F units returned 11.1% year-to-date.

During 2021, several names contributed to the positive performance. One of our largest holdings, and a company we’ve had strong conviction on, NuVista Energy, continued its positive performance in the Fund as the company benefited from oil price normalizing and a non-core asset sale that improved its liquidity profile. As of end of 2021, the Fund is yielding 6.4% to maturity with a 1.8 year duration.

Meaningful corporate bond positions that the Fund initiated at the onset of the pandemic (i.e. Ferroglobe and Spencer Spirit) and existing positions that we added well into the pandemic (i.e. Millar Western, NuVista, Tidewater Midstream, and Wildbrain) were strong contributors to the Fund’s 2021 performance.

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The net assets of the Fund increased from \$118.2 million to \$176.7 million since the beginning of the year. The Fund has mainly grown through net subscriptions of \$48.6 million.

There were no unusual changes to the components of revenue and expenses of the Fund and there were no unusual events or transactions, economic changes or market conditions that affected performance beyond what would be reasonably expected or have been described below.

The Fund did not borrow money during the year except for immaterial short-term cash overdrafts.

Recent Developments

Rapid development of vaccines along with the unwavering monetary and fiscal support of governments kept the economic wheels turning and the hope of a return to normalcy alive despite the ever-changing virus.

Equity market performance over the last two years has been compared to the Internet bubble period that started in the late 1990s. This time around, however, has been a transformative period for the stock market as retail investors have become motivated by commission-free trading, ultra-low interest rates, work from home rules, government financial support, and social media investing platforms. Their direct participation in US equity markets saw a jump after the introduction of commission-free trading in 2013 by Robinhood. This increased further at the onset of the pandemic when it averaged approximately 20 percent of all stock trading in the US.

There have been no changes to the Manager or Portfolio Manager, or change of control of the Manager, or of the Fund in the year. There have been no actual or planned reorganizations, mergers or similar transactions.

There were no changes to the membership of the Fund's Independent Review Committee ("IRC").

Related Party Transactions

The Manager provides or arranges for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, including but not limited to, calculating and reporting the net asset value of the Fund and its series, preparing all offering documents, unitholder recordkeeping and other administrative services. The Manager receives a management fee for these services. The fee is calculated based on a percentage of the net asset value of the Fund as disclosed in the simplified prospectus.

The Fund paid \$1,686,282 (including HST) in management fees to the Manager for the year ended December 31, 2021 (December 31, 2020 - \$939,730)

The Portfolio Manager is responsible for all investment advice provided to the Fund including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and arranging for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments. Fees for providing these services are included in the management fee.

The Manager paid \$767,180 (including HST) to the Portfolio Manager for the year ended December 31, 2021 (December 31, 2020 - \$431,585).

The Manager relied, or may rely on standing instructions from the IRC in respect of securities traded amongst mutual funds, closed end funds, managed accounts or pooled funds managed by the Manager or an affiliate of the Manager. In such cases the Manager is required to comply with the Manager's written policies and procedures presented to the IRC and provide periodic reports to the IRC in accordance with National Instrument 81-107.

- Net assets and distributions are based on the actual numbers of units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase (decrease) from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial period. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per unit.
- Distributions were paid in cash or reinvested in additional units, or both.
- This information is provided at the end of the period shown.
- The management expense ratio is based on the total expenses of the period ended and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset values during the period.
- The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities, excluding short term securities.
- The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

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Management Fees


The Manager provides or arranges the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund, and as described in the section “Related Party Transactions” above.

In consideration for such services, the Manager receives a monthly management fee, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund pays a management fee of 1.35% per annum for Series A units and 0.85% per annum for Series F units.

Service fees or trailing commissions of a maximum of 0.50% per annum are paid on Series A units to dealers. This comprises approximately 42% of the management fee of Series A units.

Series A




Past Performance
