## About This Report

This annual Management Report of Fund Performance of Lysander-Canso Corporate Treasury Fund (the “Fund”) contains financial highlights for the year ended December 31, 2022 but does not contain the complete financial statements of the Fund. ## Investment objective

The Fund’s objective is to provide total returns consisting principally of interest income by investing primarily in liquid short term fixed income and floating rate debt securities of Canadian and foreign issuers.

## Investment Strategies

The Fund’s portfolio manager is Canso Investment Counsel Ltd. (“Portfolio Manager” or “Canso”), a company under common control as the Manager. The Fund’s portfolio will primarily be invested in liquid, high quality fixed income and floating rate debt securities of Canadian and foreign issuers. It also may

invest in debt securities convertible into common stock, and fixed income and floating rate debt securities of governments, government agencies, supranational agencies, companies, trusts and limited partnerships. The Fund will not be leveraged. More details are contained in the Fund’s simplified prospectus.

## Risks

The risks of this Fund remain as discussed in the Fund’s most recent simplified prospectus.

## Results of Operations

During the year, Canso employed its bottom-up process to buy and sell securities for the Fund. The Fund’s positioning and performance is consistent with the Fund’s fundamental investment objective and strategies.

The Fund Series A and Series F was first made available under a prospectus on January 5, 2022 and Series C on June 01, 2022. The Fund returns for the period since inception were -0.07% for Series A, 0.08% for Series F and 1.05% for Series C.

The net assets of the Fund were approximately \$188.9 million at December 31, 2022 from \$3.0 million at January 5, 2022. Since the Fund inception on January 5, 2022, there were net subscriptions of over \$184.6 million during the year.

There were no unusual changes to the components of revenue and expenses of the Fund and there were no unusual events or transactions, economic changes or market conditions that affected performance beyond what would be reasonably expected or as described below.

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The Fund did not borrow money during the year except for immaterial short term cash overdrafts.

## Recent Developments

The aggressive tightening of monetary policy around the world marks a complete turnaround from central bank policies of a year ago. Policies put in place to support economies during the pandemic have turned out to be major contributors to high inflation. The year-over-year inflation numbers in North America and elsewhere are the highest in decades and central banks are moving to slow it down through interest rate hikes and a reversal of quantitative easing (QE).

QE involves the central banks buying their own country's government bonds to push down yields and put money directly into people's hands. QE is not a new approach to monetary policy but its scale reached records during the pandemic. It is not clear what will happen as central banks stop reinvesting maturing bonds and possibly start selling bonds they hold.

In this environment of high inflation, rising interest rates, and reduced liquidity, financial assets have not performed well. The big question is how much further the monetary and fiscal authorities have to go to get inflation under control. The risk of an economic recession continues to become more likely. This will be negative for unemployment and credit markets.

The Fund is being managed increasingly conservatively. This helps to preserve capital in a market decline and makes it easier to take advantage of future investment opportunities.

During the year, the Fund focused on establishing and adding to positions in short-dated, liquid government securities as both credit and interest rate risks remained elevated. The Fund increased its weightage in Government of Canada bonds with coupons of 0.25% and 0.50%, trading at a discount to par. This position represents over 68% of the portfolio at year-end. The Fund also established weights in high-quality, short-term corporates including Nav Canada, Hydro One, TD Bank and select USD issues. Although the Fund's target weighted average term is 1.5 years, the Fund's weighted average term as of year-end remains short at 1.0 years and a duration of 0.9 years.

There have been no changes to the Manager or Portfolio Manager, or change of control of the Manager, or of the Fund. There have been no actual or planned reorganizations, mergers or similar transactions involving the Fund.

There were no changes to the membership of the Fund's Independent Review Committee ("IRC").

## Related Party Transactions

The Manager provides or arranges to provide for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, including but not limited to, calculating and reporting the net asset value of the Fund and its series, preparing all offering documents, unitholder recordkeeping and other administrative services. The Manager receives a management fee for these services. The fee is calculated based on a percentage of the net asset value of the Fund as disclosed in the simplified prospectus.

The Fund paid \$273,963 (including HST) in management fees to the Manager for the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Portfolio Manager is responsible for all investment advice provided to the Fund including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and arranging for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments. Portfolio management fees for the Portfolio Manager's services are paid from the management fee.

The Fund paid \$273,963 (including HST) in management fees to the Manager for the year ended December 31, 2022.

The Manager relied, or may rely on standing instructions from the IRC in respect of securities traded amongst mutual funds, closed end funds, managed accounts or pooled funds managed by the Manager or an affiliate of the Manager. In such cases the Manager is required to comply with the Manager's written policies and procedures presented to the IRC and provide periodic reports to the IRC in accordance with National Instrument 81-107.

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## Management Fees

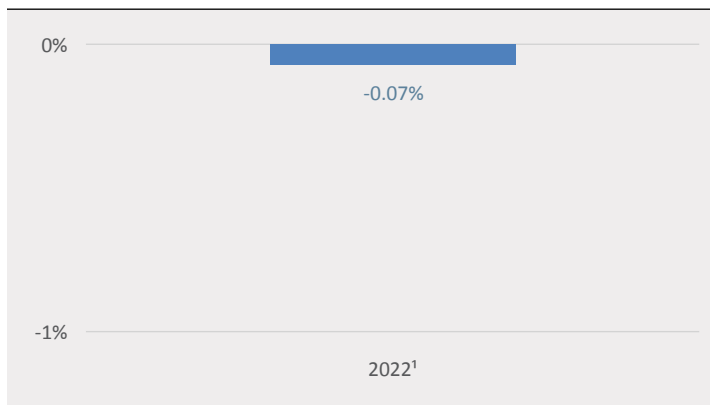
The Manager provides or arranges the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund, and as described in the section “Related Party Transactions” above.

In consideration for such services, the Manager receives a monthly management fee, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund pays a management fee at a rate of 0.40% per annum for Series A units, at a rate of 0.25% per annum for Series F units and at a rate of 0.10% per annum for Series C units.

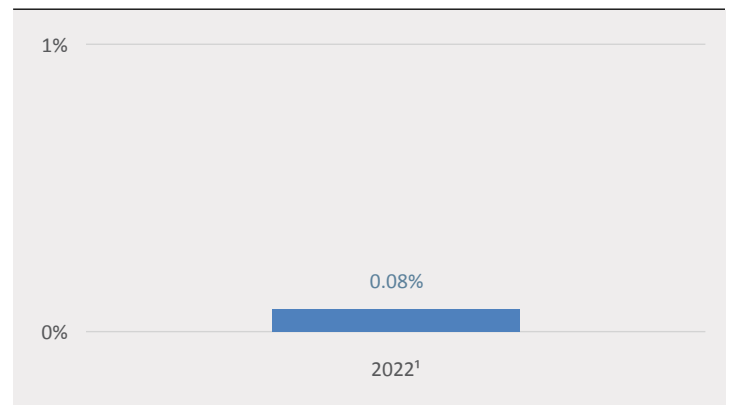
Service fees or trailing commissions of a maximum of 0.15% per annum are paid on Series A units to dealers. This comprises approximately 37.5% of the management fee of Series A units.

## Year-by-Year Returns

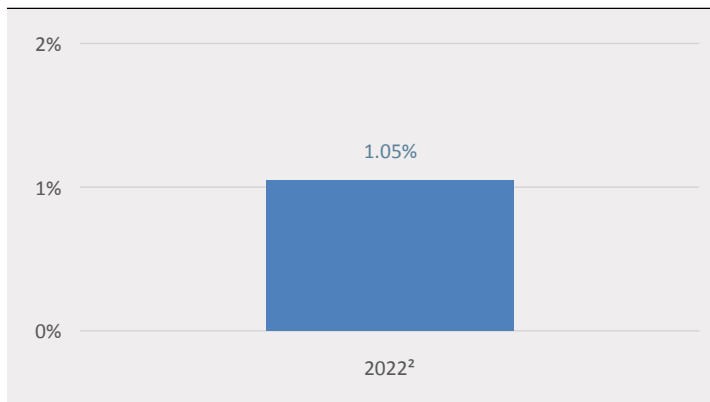
